The main purpose of the project When the bells chime is to complement the Collection exhibited and make it more visible to the visitors of the Museum and those yet to become.

A long-term goal is to make museum exhibits closer to every individual, which will be fulfilled by adding Braille labels to exhibits, acquiring the necessary equipment for individual exhibition exploration, redesigning the web page of the Museum and connecting it to the presented exhibits. By adding new content using the tactile suggestivity of the bells – witnesses of rich cultural and historical heritage of a wider area of the Istrian peninsula, the exhibits and the exhibition will become more interesting, accessible and comprehensible to the public.

In synergy with the *USEFALL* project implemented by the Town of Poreč-Parenzo, the accessibility of the exhibition to visually impaired persons has been improved. BELLS FROM ISTRIAN CHURCHES





The Collection consists of 23 church bells casted in copper and dated in the period between the 14th and the 19th century. The majority of exhibits is casted in Venice; one bell originates from Ljubljana, one from Trieste while the provenance of two bells is unknown. Decorated with flowers, leaves, abstract elements and religious motives and scenes together with inscriptions of the investor and the date of casting, the bells represent an important part of Istrian cultural heritage. The bell of the Parish church of St. Jacob in Kršan even has Glagolitic inscriptions on it.





The exhibits present only a small part of bells taken from Istrian churches during the Second World War to be used for military purposes. In 1961 some of them were returned to Istria and enlisted into the Register of movable cultural goods of the Rijeka County in 1962. The first Collection of Bells consisted of 33 registered and two unregistered bells. In the period between 1986 and 1999 twelve of them were returned to the bell owners while the rest are presented in the exhibition.
