### Forum event - Pula

On December 5, 2018 the Conference on transport multimodality was held together with the TRANSPOGOOD Forum. The main issues tackled during the Conference were possible scenarios in the Adriatic region in the context of transport towards multimodality. The Conference was organised by The Geoprogress Global Forum (GGF),



which is an international initiative promoted by the Geoprogress Journal that is an open access e-journal, submitted to a double-blind peer review, edited by Geoprogress.

EU Transport Commissioner Violeta Bulc has called for 2018 to be the "Year of Multimodality" - a year during which the Commission will raise the importance of multimodality for the EU transport system. The TRANSPOGOOD forum, although organized independently from the EC,

and in collaboration with the Geoprogress Global Forum, aims at creating an opportunity for discussion on the main EU policy and topics relating to sustainability and multimodality to contribute to the public discourse and scientific approach to a more sustainable and competitive multimodal transport.
