Public institution Development Agency of the Šibenik-Knin County and the City of Vodice, organized educational, practical and field workshops on pruning, nutrition and olive grafting.

The first field workshop Olive pruning with an emphasis on olive nutrition was on March 3rd, 2023 at 3:00 p.m. in the olive grove at Ante Starčevića 72, Vodice.

At the workshop, which was attended by a large number of interested olive growers as well as the general public (63 participants), ph.d. Šime Marcelić, an assistant at the Department of Ecology, Agronomy and Aquaculture of the University of Zadar, presented the pruning of the crop but also referred to the regenerative pruning itself, which removes large branches on the olive tree. In the same way, the main growing forms of the olive (polyconical vase and free vase) are presented, as well as the reasons for maintaining the form of the growing form itself, the differences between native and degenerate branches, and water intake.

An example showed the difference between native and inborn branch and waterspouts. Regarding fertilization, emphasis was placed on the importance of using pomace, pruning residues, and other organic fertilizers, but it was also pointed out that the basis of each fertilization must be soil and leaf analysis to reduce the negative impact on the environment through excessive fertilization.

At the end of March/beginning of April, a second field workshop "Grafting or screwing olive trees" is planned with a focus on the basic reasons for olive grafting. The workshops will be held depending on the weather conditions, and for the exact date and time, we invite you to follow the official website of the Development Agency of Šibenik-Knin County.

Public institution Development Agency of the Šibenik-Knin County and the City of Vodice, are organizing educational, practical and field workshops on pruning, nutrition and olive grafting.

The first field workshop Olive pruning with an emphasis on olive nutrition will explain the pruning that is carried out during the spring, but also refer to the regenerative pruning itself, which removes large branches on the olive tree. Getting to know the main growing forms of the olive tree (polyconical vase and free vase) as well as the reasons for maintaining the form of the growing form itself, the differences between native and born branches and watering. With an example, they would show the differences between native and inborn branches and waterspouts. Regarding fertilization, emphasis would be placed on the importance of using pomace, pruning residues and other organic fertilizers, but it should also be emphasized that the basis of each fertilization must be soil and leaf analysis in order to reduce the negative impact on the environment through excessive fertilization.

After that, there is room for discussion, which will surely be related to the upcoming protection against peacock eye and olive moth and foliar feeding through the leaves for better fertilization in May.

Workshop on the topic of eco measures and eco schemes in agriculture and their importance for sustainable tourism was successfuly held on Thursday, March 30, 2023 in Adriatic Business Center in Sibenik in the organization by the Development Agency of Šibenik-Knin County.

At the workshop, which was attended by a large number (34 participants), not only of farmers from the area of the county, but also of the general public, new developments in the Common Agricultural Policy were presented with an emphasis on Eco Schemes and Eco measures, and for farmers to understand the new ways of applying for subsidies.

The main lecturer Domagoj Horvat from the AgriBioCert Cooperative, which is an authorized control body for conducting expert control and certification in the field of organic production, stated that 2023 is a reference year in agriculture because new rules regarding agriculture are starting: from the reduction of subsidies for conventional agriculture to the changes in green payments.

The aforementioned workshop was held within the TAKE IT SLOW project since the project is aimed at encouraging the culture of food, gastronomy, and lifestyle through sustainable tourism products and services. Within the project, Šibenik-Knin County has focused on ecological agriculture and production, especially considering the modern way of life and the increased demand for ecological products on the market.

Since the beginning of this year, as part of the TAKE IT SLOW project, the Development Agency has conducted a whole series of workshops throughout the county dedicated to ecological agriculture and production: from the cultivation, processing, and promotion of medicinal herbs and fruits and vegetables that thrive in Dalmatia, the advantages of ecological production and certification and a series of field workshops dedicated to the olive growing sector, which is one of the strategic sectors of the county.

Public institution Development Agency of the Šibenik-Knin County organized the second workshop under the "SMALL SCHOOL OF OLIVE GROWING" dedicated to olive pruning with an emphasis on olive grafting and spring protection against pests as a part of the TAKE IT SLOW project.

The workshop was held on Friday, April 21st 2023, at 3:00 p.m. in the olive grove at the address: Maslinik obitelji Mateša (Bumba), Vodice, Put Okita.

At the workshop, which was attended by a large number of interested olive growers as well as the general public (42 participants).

This workshop explained the basic reasons for vaccination, one of which is the introduction of a new variety of olive for better fertilization, which ultimately affects the fertility of olive trees. It also explained the relationship between the olive variety and the location of cultivation, thus covering the advantages and disadvantages of autochthonous and introduced olive varieties. The selection and type of grafts used for olive grafting were presented. Several grafting techniques were demonstrated: under the bark, on a split and on a "window", and on an oblique cut, and it will be briefly explained which method is suitable for a specific purpose. As for spring protection against pests, at the end of the workshop, an integrated and ecological approach to the protection of olive diseases and pests in the spring period were described.

The main lecturer was Ph.D. Šime Marcelić, an assistant at the Department of Ecology, Agronomy and Aquaculture of the University of Zadar. He is an active member of the Association of Sensory Analysts of Olive Oil "Olea" Zadar, the Association of Olive Growers "Paičuša" and the Association of Olive Growers of Zadar County. His field of scientific interest is technologies in olive growing, and on the professional side, more advanced olive production.
