### **Event summary**

The public event was organised in the scope of Terrà, the second energy transition Forum, which took place in Pescara, Italy, on 22-23 June 2023 <u>https://www.terrapescara.it/</u>, and dealt with the topics of sustainability, environmental protection and green transition. The Forum is an annual meeting involving national and international reference bodies and stakeholders of the sector, in order to transfer best practices in Italy, Europe and at international level. Professor Gino D'Ovidio, Director of Citrams, in representation of the Abruzzo Region, outlined the MIMOSA project and the results of the pilot actions carried out on the occasion of a round table that was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> June.

## Audience

The audience participating in the Forum was composed of local, regional and national policy-makers, representatives of sectoral businesses and associations, regional and national sustainable transport networks, academics, experts, general public. The participants were about 100.
