EVENT DESCRIPTION

On 28 May 2020 at 8.30 pm an on line meeting was held with a group of 18-19 year olds Scouts and their coordinators.

The Scout Group is based in the municipality of Marcon in the province of Venice

The references of the group were: AGESCI, Gruppo scout Marcon 1, Adress: via Antonio Meucci, 20, 30020, Marcon (VE).

Francesco Rech (ARPAV Technicians) reported on the state of knowledge on the issue of climate change. In particular, the meteo-climatic data collected and processed by ARPAV were illustrated, which clearly highlight the variations in temperature with increases of more than 0.5 ° C per decade in the last 30 years and the increase in the variability of annual rainfall. With information on the retreat of the Venetian ice, on the increase in the level of the Adriatic sea and the number of extreme storms, the speaker tried to provide an overall picture of the problems deriving from climate warming which are also evident on a regional scale.

The contents of the IPCC periodic reports were also illustrated. IPCC identify human activities of greenhouse gas emissions as a certain cause of global warming.

The activities of ARPAV within the RESPONSe Project and the aims of the project were illustrated.

The purpose of the meeting was to raise awareness among young citizens on the issue of climate change by highlighting impacts, perspectives and the role of adaptation and mitigation action.

The on line meeting was attended by about 10 scouts.
Participants in the initiative fall into the category of general public.

Note: Italy was in full Covid emergency with the impossibility of holding meetings in presence. The speaker made the first videoconference in his life, from home, with a precarious telephone line and did not have the spirit to make a screen shot of the participants. Subsequently two requests, via e-mail, to provide a list of participants fell on deaf ears. We have no idea of the exact number of participants but the initiative is equally reported to highlight the effort to continue the communication activity in any case even in the situation of a health emergency.
