1. Introduction

Public events will be carried out with specific target groups in mind. This includes tourist operators, local entrepreneurs, sectoral agencies (employment, integrated development, cultural heritage protection), busine sssupport organisations, NGOs involved in cultural heritage valorisation, SMEs providing local tourist services (diving centres, boat/diving equipment rental, accommodation, guides). Representatives of local, regional, national institutions will be invited to provide capacity building feedback. A Final Event will be held to present the project's findings to the general public and relevant stakeholders, and will be advertised through a photographic exhibition on underwater landscapes. Through the involvement of local youths and professional underwater photographers, the event will sensitize local communities, while also promoting underwater tourism among potential high-end visitors, eco-tourists and photojournalists.

Application form envisaged D.2.4.1: Participation to local events linked to tourist fairs/festivals and travel exhibitions. Production of local promotional material, setting up of promotion stands, workshops, presentations targeting particularly youngsters and schools, seeking their involvement in the photographic exhibition. Each partner participates to at least one such local event



The participation of PI RERA SD at fair was postponed several times because of pandemic that started at the beginning of 2020. Since February 20202 planned to participate to several other events that were cancelled or postponed. After several consultations and confirmation from organizer the project team applied to participate at external International fair SASO. The SASO fair is dedicated to the construction and sustainable development the important and is one of most economic fairs in the region (https://www.sasofair.com/totalno-drukciji-od-drugih-otvoren-sajam-saso-uz-jake-epidemioloske-mjere/).

The fair SASO 2021. organized in Split from November $10^{th} - 13^{th}$) was the only international fair in the year of 2021 organized in Split. Due to pandemic of COVID-19 all other events were either cancelled or organized online. As per estimation of organizer (information received by email) the fair was visited by approx. 9.500 people. The fair was used to promote the ongoing project activities but also to promote ongoing photo contest and invite people, especially youngsters, to take part in the photo contest.

PI RERRA SD and Kaštela City participated at the event from 10th to 13th November 2021. The participation included:

- Info table for holding laptop and promotional materials
- Information of the project linked to the website of the fair
- LED display with main info about the project

The PM also participated at the conference that was organized as a part of fair on November 11th, 2021. The title of conference was: Touristic network – sustainable management of maritime assets for the future of Croatian tourism, which included participation of several other projects from Split – Dalmatia County and presentation of Coastal plan for Split Dalmatia County.

3. Barcolana, Trieste Participation to local events in Friuli Venezia Giulia – Barcolana, Trieste (IT)

In the first week of October 2021 in Trieste was held the traditional Barcolana (https://www.barcolana.it/), a historic international sailing regatta organized yearly by the yacht club Società Velica di Barcola e Grignano. The regatta, recognized as one of the most crowded regattas in the world (Guinness World Record holder in February 2019 with 2,689 boats), itself takes place in the Gulf of Trieste on the second Sunday of October.

It represents not only a maritime/sailing event but also the venue of collateral sea-related events: in the **Barcolana Village** along the city seafront, stands offer food and wine areas, areas dedicated to the sponsors, exhibitions of technical equipment and cultural meetings and conferences which see the participation of numerous people and tourists also from abroad

With the occasion, ERPAC FVG, project Lead partner, in collaboration with the regional tourist office PromoTurismo FVG (https://www.promoturismo.fvg.it/) planned its promotional presence during the event in Trieste. For this reason, they were produced some specific advertising products:

- a 5 minutes' video summarising UnderwaterMuse activities at the Grado 2 underwater site (full video available), and
- > a leaflet (with both Italian and English versions) focusing on the project pilot actions carried out for the conservation





Project partner Ca'Foscary participated at local event that was held in Arsenale of Venice, May 28 – June 5 2022 and presented the main goals, activities and results of the project UnderwaterMuse.



During the conference were presented in detail the results of the first phase of the pilot intervention on the underwater archaeological site of Torre Santa Sabina.

The research was carried out in the period 07-30 September 2020 by the regional universities (the Universities of Salento, Foggia and Bari) involved by Puglia Region thanks to an agreement. The fruitful synergy with the other actors (SABAP, Politecnico di Torino, Municipality of Carovigno, Hotel Consortium of Carovigno, Association A.S.S.O., the Angelo Colucci Company) and the support of the territory and the community allowed the achievement of the objectives of the preliminary campaign to the broader and more articulated next intervention.

Thanks to the collaboration with Politecnico di Torino, the entire stretch of coast was mapped with drone flights, in order to reconstruct the coastal landscape in the various phases, starting from the Bronze Age.

A targeted intervention was carried out on the Torre Santa Sabina 1 wreck, a boat of the Roman Imperial Age beached and abandoned on the ancient shore and now submerged due to the relative rise in sea level.

The research confirmed also the presence of the remains of the Galea Magna, the ship of the Serenissima which left Candia (Crete) and was shipwrecked at the entrance to the bay in 1598.

Moreover, was verified the extent of the rich deposit represented by the stratigraphy of loads resulting from the various shipwreck episodes, accumulated at the foot of the western cliff and that have returned



merchandise from an archaic Greek ship (late 6th - early 5th century BC), a Roman cargo carrying oil and wine from the Salento together with refined imported ceramics (late 2nd century BC), and another late antiquity cargo from the eastern Mediterranean (5th-6th century AD).

6. Giornate Europee dell'Archeologia - Conferenza "Il porto ritrovato", Lecce

Puglia Region, in collaboration with the Museum and Library Hub of Lecce and the University of Salento, organized the local event "The rediscovered harbour" as part of the international initiative "European Days of Archaology".

The public conference was held at Castromediano Museum on Saturday 19 June2021 to fully present the archaeological research / non-invasive archaeological investigations carried out by the Cultural Heritage Department of the University of Salento in the area of the WWF Reserve "Le Cesine" – San Cataldo (LE).

During the research, carried out as part of the UnderwaterMuse Project, were identified very important structures in the locality "Posto San Giovanni". These structures give back a much more complex vision of the ancient harbour of Lupiae. In particular, the foundation of an imposing pier built in the typical technique of the Adriatic landing structures was found, made of large parallelepiped blocks of local stone, about 8 m wide and extending for a length of about one hundred m.

7. Festival "Strade di Sabbia. Suoni e parole dal Mediterraneo"

The Festival (9, 16, 23, 24 September 2021) was organized as part of Project UnderwaterMuse by Puglia Region (Department of Tourism, Economy of Culture and Valorization of the Territory / International Cooperation / Museums and Libraries Hubs) in collaboration with ESAC "Euromediterranean Seascapes Archaeology Center", National Superintendence for the Underwater Cultural Heritage, University of Salento, University of Foggia and University of Bari.

The festival intended to narrate the "culture of the sea", the history and the identities of coastal communities through artistic events, guided tours, public conferences, workshops. The aim was to offer a moment of reflection, analysis and scientific dissemination of related issues at the sea.

The main objective was the involvement of the local communities that with a process of active participation were invited to rediscover their own identity characters through the protection of collective memory and the valorization of the material and immaterial cultural heritage.



9. "Un tuffo lungo 3000 anni: archeologia subacquea a Porto Cesaro"

The public conference, 27 September 2021, was held in Porto Cesareo at Torre Chianca to present the results of the archeological research in the Marine Protected Area of Porto Cesareo (LE), carried out as part of the UnderwaterMuse Project by the Department of Cultural Heritage of University of Salento.

The event was organized by Puglia Region in collaboration with the University of Salento, the Marine Protected Area of Porto Cesareo, the Superintendence of Archaeology Fine Arts and Landscapes of Brindisi and Lecce, ESAC "Euromediterranean Seascapes Archaeology Center", the Municipality of Porto Cesareo, the Coordinamento Ambientalisti Pro Porto Cesareo Onlus.

During the conference were also illustrated the significant perspectives of valorization of the underwater cultural heritage of the Marine Protected Area, with the aim of realize an underwater archaeological park in the naturalistic reserve, as in the UnderwaterMuse objectives. Moreover, was offered to the public the use of Oculus Quest for the fruition of the app with the 3D reconstruction of the wreck of the Columns of Porto Cesareo.

The research was carried out in the inlet of the Camerini Bay of Torre Santa Sabina (Municipality of Carovigno) in the period 30 August-10 October 2021 as the second part of the pilot action of the UnderwaterMuse Project and was possible thanks to the permit of MiC - Ministry of Culture to the University of Salento, through the Superintendence of Archeology Fine Arts and Landscape for the provinces of Brindisi and Lecce.

After the campaign of September 2020, this was the second phase of the of the pilot intervention of the *UnderwaterMuse* Project. As the previous one, for this ambitious project also the 2021 intervention was carried out by the three regional Universities thanks to the agreement with the Puglia Region, which has involved the Universities of Salento, Bari and Foggia.



The investigations focused on the important late imperial wreck Torre Santa Sabina 1 (late 3rd - early 4th century AD). Thanks to an accurate and patient excavation, the wreck revealed exceptional elements. It is an almost unique case in the Mediterranean because the hull still shows elements of the upper part, such as the deck boards and the beams on which they rested. It probably was a merchant ship over 25 meters long and fairly heavy in tonnage that came from the Tunisian coast and transported wine or sauces and fish preserves from the North African provinces maybe to Brindisi or another important Adriatic port.

12. Open days of EU projects in the City of Kaštela

On March 26th and 27th, Open days of EU projects in the City of Kaštela were held in the period from 10:00 to 13:00. The days were held at two locations, in Kaštel Stari and Kaštel Štafilić. The aim was to inform citizens and the general public with the projects that are implementing now in the City, as well as with already implemented projects, both co-financed by EU funds. Mayor Denis Ivanović also spoke with the citizens, pointing out that the City of Kaštela has withdrawn around 140 million kuna from European funds in the last three years with infrastructure, social and cultural projects. In order to inform citizens better, promotional brochures were distributed with a lots of data, such as the goal and purpose of the project, value, financial investments in specific projects financed by EU funds and by the City itself, list of project associates, deadlines and so on. Employees of the Department of EU Funds were at the disposal of citizens, giving them answers to all questions and uncertainties. Projects PMOgate, Adriseismic, Value, Underwater and Zaželi were in particular presented. Citizens have shown great interest in events of this type.
