





## Archaeology for all for with University of Ferrara and VALUE Project

In line with VALUE project objective of spreading the archaeological culture, a university webinar in live streaming, free and open to general audience, has been launched on February 25.

The webinar, organized in collaboration with University of Ferrara and held by Prof. Rachele Dubbini and PhD Francesca Romana Fiano, will give the possibility to learn the main methods and practices of the archaeological survey, with attention to the archaeological site of Bocca delle Menate in Comacchio and the organization of the survey that will be carried out on site in April 2021.

Identified as a Roman villa on the waters of the Po Delta in 1956, the discover of the site was at obscured by the sensational discovery of the ancient Etruscan city of Spina. The partial publication of the surveys and the renewed interest of the Municipality of Comacchio, which today relies on the innovative setting up of the Ancient Delta Museum, now opens new perspectives for site life, also thanks the activities realized by the University of Ferrara.

The archaeological laboratory of the Roman Villa of Bocca delle Menate in Comacchio will start a new season of investigations that will be carried out by a team of specialists and students. The UniFe archaeological laboratory will also become a precious opportunity to relate to the territory and its community.

## TOWN OF CRES - Unique Trail Sign

As the process of creating a visual identity of the historical trails of the island Cres is progressing, the Town of Cres has held meetings with stakeholders to discuss the unique trail sign to accompany visitors along the trail and keep them safe and oriented.

It has been decided that the sign behind the historical Cres trail, now under the name Via Apsyrtides, will be a blue and red mark in the shape of the letters VA, where the blue represents the island and the sea, and the red dot reminds the visitors of the standard international hiking trail mark.

During the spring period, a total of 75 km of pathways will be blazed with this VA mark, and a local event to promote the Via Apsyrtides will be held at the end of spring.



## Master in Cultural Management MuSeC on starting blocks
