## Presentation of the project results to policy makers in Split, Rome and Zagreb

The project was promoted to the policy makers in Split on 17<sup>th</sup> of June 2021. The name of the event was: The underwater noise and its impact on the marine biological resources. The main organizer was our project partner **Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development** (MESD). To this event have participated 28 people.

**Consiglio Nazionale delle Ricerche (CNR)** organized one day meeting in Rome, on 16<sup>th</sup> November 2021, involving Italian Ministry of Ecological Transition and Italian Ministry of Transports and Infrastructures, in orderto disseminate project results and achievements. 22 in presence participant and 10 online participants took part to this event.

On 15<sup>th</sup> November 2021, MESD organized another event in Zagreb to disseminate projectresults to policy makers, 17 people have participated.

During the meetings PP1 and PP6 have illustrated the project results to the authorities and asked for their feedback with particular focus on the implementation of the MSFD D11.



#### MINUTES OF THE MEETING

Workshop "Underwater noise and its impact on marine biological resources" was organized by project partner Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development (PP6) in Split on 17<sup>th</sup> of June. The meeting was held in Radisson Blu Resort & Spa. The workshop was part of the D2.4.2. Presentation of the project results to policy makers.

The workshop was held for the protected areas/natural heritage management bodies, universities and research institutes and NGOs. There were 12 different stakeholders present: Public institution for Protected natural values of Šibenik-Knin County, Public institution for Protected natural values of Zadar County, Public institution for Protected natural values of Dubrovnik-Neretva County, Public institution for Protected natural values of Split County, Public institution for Protected natural values of Primorsko-goranska County, Public Institution Nature Park Lastovo Islands, Public Institution Nature Park Telašćica, Public Institution National Park Brijuni, University of Zadar, University of Split, Institute of Oceanography and Fisheries and Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development

Welcoming speech was given by Ms Josipa Perković (representative of the Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development) and Mr Vlado Dadić, Soundscape project manager. Because it was the first live event after COVID-19 restrictions, they thanked everyone for coming to Split.

In the first part of the workshop Mr Predrag Vukadin held the introduction lecture on underwater noise: classification, characteristics and its impact on marine biological resources. Mr Hrvoje Mihanović talked about some major international projects on underwater noise research (IQOE, BIAS, JOMOPANS, QM-1-2, ADEON) and Mr Dadić presented some of the results of monitoring of underwater noise in Croatia so far.

After these introductory presentations, Mr Dadić presented project Soundscape by WPs, its goals and challenges.

The agenda was a bit changed because Ms Nikolina Rako Gospić from the Blue World Institute held her presentation via Zoom platform so it started after the coffee break. The presentation was on results of research on the impact of underwater noise on sensitive species (bottlenose dolphins, turtles). The research was conducted by the Blue World Institute.

Mr Frano Matić had the presentation on measurement methodology and underwater noise monitoring program, Mr Damir Ivanković on data storage and display and Mr Mihanović on preliminary results of measurement and spatio-temporal modeling of underwater noise.

The last presentation was held by Mr Vukadin on data integration and decision support tools. Due to lack of time, Mr Dadić didn't held the presentation about the support in the application of ODMS for D11 in Croatia and the issue of impulse noise.

At the end, and before lunch, there was a discussion on underwater noise in the Adriatic Sea. Ms Perković pointed out that the present stakeholders were part of the nature conservation sector so that part was the most interesting for them to discuss. Some of the participants form the national and nature parks said that they became aware of that problem just recently and they are realising it now, how big the problem is.

In addition to research, the next step will be a presentation of the project results to the authorities with particular focus on the implementation of the Marine Strategy Framework Directive, in respect to Descriptor 11 – Descriptor 11: Energy incl. Underwater Noise.

Mr Dadić and Ms Perković have announced a meeting to be held at the ministry level in September 2021.







Presentation of the project Soundscape for policy makers was organized by project partner Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development (PP6) in Zagreb on 15<sup>th</sup> of November. The meeting was held in Hotel International. The workshop was part of the D2.4.2. Presentation of the project results to policy makers.

There were 9 different state administration bodies invited: Directorate of Water Management and Marine Protection (MESD), Directorate for Nature Protection (MESD), Energy Directorate (MESD), Ministry of the Sea, Transport and Infrastructure, Ministry of Agriculture, Material Resource Direcotrate (Ministry of Defence), Service for Military Air and Maritime Traffic (Ministry of Defence), Ministry of Physical Planning, Construction and State Assets and Ministry of Internal Affairs and 4 of them were present at the meeting: Directorate for Nature Protection (MESD), Energy Directorate (MESD), Material Resource Direcotrate (Ministry of Defence) and Ministry of Physical Planning, Construction and State Assets.

Welcoming speech was given by Mr Aljoša Duplić, director of the Institute for Environment and Nature from MESD, which organized the meeting.

After the participants introduced themselves, Mr Vlado Dadić, project manager, gave overview of the project Soundscape. From the introductory presentation we saw the difference between the traffic density in the Adriatic in 2019 and in the pandemic 2020.

Mr Predrag Vukadin held the introduction lecture on underwater noise: classification, characteristics and its impact on marine biological resources.

Mr Hrvoje Mihanović had presentation on underwater noise monitoring program and the second one was on results of measurement and spatio-temporal modeling of underwater noise. A discussion on the availability of data was initiated, as the representative of the Energy Directorate Ms Leško pointed out that the Ruđer Bošković Institute collects environmental data around natural gas exploitation platforms owned by oil and gas company "INA" in north Adriatic Sea, including the underwater noise data, and a part of the data is publicly available on request. The representatives of IOF pointed out that this data wasn't available to them. Mr Katušić from Institute for Environment and Nature, MESD said that maybe the problem wasn't the availability of data but in the fact that there is no knowledge of the existence of certain data therefore we cannot even know what is available to us if we do not know what data exists.



After the coffee break Mr Grgur Pleslić from the Blue World Institute presented the results of research on the impact of underwater noise on sensitive species (bottlenose dolphins, turtles). The research was conducted by the Blue World Institute.

The last presentation was held by Mr Dadić about Soundscape project and Croatian underwater noise monitoring (continuous and pulse) in the application of ODMS and IMAP (BK) in the Republic of Croatia.

Ms Kovačić from the Ministry of Physical Planning, Construction and State Assets had a question regarding the environmental impact assessment and underwater noise and whether the introduction of regulations for the marine environment is being considered. Ms Uroš from Directorate for Nature Protection (MESD), said that they are working on it, but since she does not work directly on those jobs, she cannot say more information with certainty.

At the end, Mr Katušić thanked everyone for coming and stressed the importance of mutual cooperation, communication and data flow. He repeated the position of the Institute for Environment and Nature that all data paid with public money should be publicly available and in that sense all data that the Institute has within the Soundscape project, and in general, are available to the public.

#### Conclusion

During this meeting the most important issue discussed certainly concerned data: from the lack of usability to the lack of sharing. MESD (Institute for Environment and Nature) said that the problem wasn't the availability of data but that there is no knowledge of the existence of certain data. Considering this, at the end, Mr Katušić stressed the importance of mutual cooperation, communication and data flow. MESD also proposed not only to share the data but also to share the reports with the final results of the project in their website. Everyone agreed that it is important that all data paid with public money should be publicly available and in that sense all data available to the public.
