## Participation to SERN Seminar

### Initiative summary

Location: Cervia – Italy – Hotel Universal

Date: 11th - 12th May 2023

Manifestation main organizers: Municipality of Cervia, SERN – Sweden Emilia-Romagna Network

#### Description of the initiative:

SERN is one of the main transnational networks in Europe fostering relations between Northern and Southern Europe and in particular between Sweden and Italy. As a non-profit transnational association, SERN has three characteristics that makes it unique:

- It is the only bilateral network in the European Union that brings together actors from the Northern and Southern states;
- It is a multilevel network where different levels of government interact and collaborate.
- It is open to civil society and to private actors

Since its creation, the network developed more than 130 projects at European level and is driving a continuous process of exchange and cooperation between Swedes and Italians. A cooperation that, with the new strategy 2021-2027, will continue in the next seven years towards more inclusive communities, crucial for a sustainable European integration, through services for vulnerable groups, active citizenship and quality education. Communities that are also digitalized with open and efficient public administrations and digital skills for all; that are green and sustainable, focusing on actions to reduce vulnerability to the effects of climate change, to enhance sustainable tourism and smart mobility.

The Municipality of Cervia, together with many other public bodies of Emilia-Romagna and Sweden is member of the network, which is a great opportunity to work together on cooperation projects on topics of common interest.

Every year all members meet during a 2 days event which, besides the management/institutional meetings, foresees a rich programme of workshops and labs on topics of common interest, where participants can present project ideas, best practices, results of implemented projects, etc. to share them and keep building on experiences.

The Municipality of Cervia hosted the 2023 annual event which took place on 11<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> May. It contributed to the general logistic organisation as well as the programme preparation.

Adripromtour was presented on 12<sup>th</sup> May in the frame of the workshop on sustainable tourism, to explain how EU funded projects can contribute to local green deals, and particularly how Adripromtour contributes to the implementation and promotion of sustainable tourism.

## Participation to UPREST Seminar

#### Initiative summary

Location: Opatija – Croatia – Hubbazia center

Date: 13th - 16th June 2023

Manifestation main organizers: UPREST Project Erasmus + - 2nd Technical project meeting

### Description of the initiative:

The project "UPREST - UP- & REskilling Sustainable Tourism in a new digital era" is funded by Erasmus+ Programme, whose general objective is to increase the digital skills of the actors in the field of sustainable tourism while promoting new learning pathways in order to contribute to the recovery of the sector. In the aftermath of the Covid-19 pandemic and its devastating effects on the European tourist sector in general, it is vital that appropriate policies and measures are taken at the local level across Europe to ensure that the new, post-pandemic tourism industry becomes competitive and relevant to needs and expectations of future visitors. Both digital experiences and sustainability are key issues for many tourists today when deciding which cities and countries they want to visit, and so we believe that these two issues hold a great potential for development in the respective partners' local ecosystems. To take advantage of such a potential, it is necessary for local officials together with tourist organizations and professionals in tourist sector to get upskilled through innovative continuing education and training.

In the framework of UPREST three project results are under development:

- 1. Map of the local training needs consisting of (A) a set of local "maps" providing a detailed picture of the situation in terms of knowledge and skills, and related training needs, among the organisations of the sustainable tourism ecosystem and (B) a collection of best practices.
- 2. Training Package fostering digital skills in sustainable tourism; designed for C-VET providers both private as well as public ones (local authorities) but ultimately the learning contents will be addressing the actors of
- the tourism sector, such as staff of travel agencies, hotel, tourist agencies, natural parks, cultural centers, museum, etc. The package will include a specific set of Learning Outcomes (LO) and allocated time for each

learning unit. It will include -2 face-to-face units -A peer review based unit -an assessment framework -a tutor's manual aimed at facilitating the implementation of the Package

3. Guidelines for continuing follow-up activities on sustainable tourism consisting of a set of practical indications for the local authorities or those organisations playing a policy or coordinating role towards target groups of the project, aimed at ensuring a successful long-term process of upskilling for a larger number of actors of the ecosystem and an upscaling of the process locally and regionally.



The LP of the project is the Municipality of Vänersborg (SE). Partners are SERN (IT), Municipality of Cervia (IT), University of Högskolan Väst (SE), Kvarner Region Tourism Board (HR).

The Municipality of Cervia as member of the consortium attended the project meeting held in Opatija in June. The main aim of the meeting was to discuss the organisation of the training activity foreseen in Sweden in September 2023 addressing tourism operators from the partner territories. The participants will be trained on AI, VR, Big Data to learn on their use and potential application in the frame of sustainable tourism. In this framework, the main results of Adripromtour were presented, and in particular the VR platform as an example of VR application which could be enclosed in the training programme foreseen in Sweden in September as practical example of VR application.
