The museum is located in the evocative frame of the ancient Olivetani Monastery. Following an innovative and scenographic route, the exhibition guide you through 5 different historical eras.







NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM RIJEKA




At the museum you can explore permanent exhibitions on geological past and fossil life of the region, sharks and other underwater inhabitants, as well as land animals.
